About the speaker:

Dr. Paul Conway, Director of Information Technology Services at Duke University Libraries, provides leadership for all of the libraries' technology programs and services and represents library technology interests on the Duke campus and in regional, national, and international organizations. His particular focus is the development of the Digital Library @ Duke as a comprehensive program of services and tools for the provision and preservation of digital resources for the Duke University community.

Dr. Conway is project consultant to an Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) 2002 National Leadership Grant awarded to the University of Pittsburgh. The two-year grant requires collaboration between libraries and museums to create innovative access to a body of photographic material. The University of Pittsburgh's Archives Service Center, the Historical Society of Western Pennsylvania, and the Carnegie Museum of Art are working together to make their nationally significant visual image collections of the Pittsburgh region accessible via a single Web gateway created and managed by the University's Digital Research Library.
