Respecting the first house built
in Brownsville a letter at Red Stone
apparently I spoke to you yesterday -

In Vol 2 of the Merion Pioneer p 62
there is a picture of Michael Custos
house at Red Stone Red In. which the
editor Jas L. Burman states "your
circumstances supposed to have been
erected in 1770." And so it is repeated in
Pamphlets of Red p 32. In the Merion's

of Lt. Henry Ambulake (sent to London in 1765) who served in the Regiment of Col. M. Boyd of Virginia I received to British after the Campaign and for 1759 at Fort Pitt under Gen. Stanwix - he says that General in the fall of that year gave him the command of Fort Mifflin about 60 miles to the east of Pittsburgh where I remained about nine months at a very great expense partly through hospitality to those who passed to and from Pittsburgh and the dearer of my own and partly by building myself a house and making several improvements and finishing the dock constructed for the West India by a company of the Pennsylvania Regiment in the Spring and return to Pittsburgh.
