“Without Sanctuary: Lynching Photography in America”

This rare collection documents lynching in America from the 1870s through the 1950s with over 100 photographs. During this period mobs lynched thousands of African-Americans without fear or accountability and often with the complicity of the press and local governments. Opening briefly in Manhattan, the New York Historical Society followed with a variation of the exhibit and extended the timeframe to popular demand. Come see this moving exhibit, as well as gallery space devoted to Pittsburgh's link to the anti-lynching movement via the New Pittsburgh Courier.
