History was made last week by a Chamber Member with the help of Chamber Members, Supporters, & Partners. Chamber Chairman Bob Agbede (President & CEO of Advanced Technology Systems) & Supporter Chester Engineers, part of **USFilter Engineering &** Construction Co., were awarded a contract worth over \$30 million dollars over the next several years with Corporate Sponsor-Pgh Water & Sewer Authority. Member Joseph Preston is the Chairman of the Authority. Both have done business with PWSA, but their joint venture marks the authority's largest contract award involving

a minority firm and demonstrates their commitment to the city MBE program. It further opens doors for other African American firms to expand doing business in the city. This reaffirms what the Chamber's mission is committed to and we want you to join us in congratulating them; four Chamber Members helping to advance inclusion and promote economic development!

Chairman's Circle Member Victor Roque recently announced a partnership with Corporate Sponsor Roy Flores to establish the Electric Distribution Technology (EDT) **Program at Community** College of Allegheny County. This two-year degree program will combine academic experience with handson technical training that will produce an associate in science degree in Electric Distribution Technology. Graduates of the program may qualify for employment as an overhead line-worker and can expect a starting salary of \$40k per year. You will hear more info on the program.

Member Rob Jones presented Neighborhood Housing Services with a \$5,000 grant for pre-paid work-shops on owning your home. The goal is

to place 500 clients in homes in one year.

Now all forms of ID must show the same name and or date of birth, or association between the information on the documents. Additional documents are needed if a connection can't be established between the documents.
