Estimates are each district will have about 37k people (conforming with the 2002 census), a drop from the 41,000 set in 1993. The re-mapping must be finished by 2003 when five seats are up for reelection.

Developer Irv Williams recently held the Grand Opening of One Hope Center, an office building on Centre Avenue. This is the second one for Irv, and based upon the look of the structure, finding tenants should not be a problem.
