

She & Member William 'Bill' Robinson were both victorious in their race for County Council. Congratulations to each of them. The next forum is September 11<sup>th</sup> when candidates Dan Onorato & Jim Roddey come before you to discuss who should be our Allegheny County Chief Executive.

June 20<sup>th</sup> is our next PowerBreakfast Meeting when Dr. John Thompson will discuss his upcoming plans & formally introduce Paula Castlebury, his new MBE Coordinator. He will also be asked to discuss what affect Patrick Dowd winning in the primary may have on who may become the President of the School Board.
