

The Chamber's Business Institute Program was established in response to a 2000 study of over 1,200 minority businesses funded by Merrill Lynch. The study found four success factors were needed for minority businesses: Effective utilization of technology, participation in social and business networks, the ability to access

markets outside of their traditional areas, & business support such as strategic planning and marketing. We have begun the implementation of this program. The mission of the Chamber's Business Institute, therefore is to tap the expertise of industry & academic leaders to provide small business owners the coaching, leadership development, & business acumen needed to achieve entrepreneurial excellence to compete in the global marketplace. This includes providing for life-long learning thru a series of lectures & presentations by industry leaders that will help to move your business to the next level of engagement. This part of the Institute program is open to Chamber members as well as non-members, however a Business Advisory Council will conduct the business reviews & make the selection for the first class of participants that will have regular business plan reviews and coaching. The response from the business community has been very supportive, volunteering to play a role in assisting you to grow.
