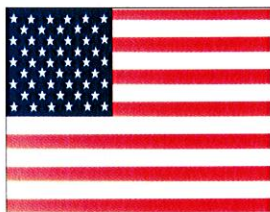

The results of the Members survey were reported at the Annual Meeting. The good news is we had an 18% response rate;

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the surprise was who responded. The majority of responses were from our Associate/Non-profit members, suggesting a separate track for their development. Highlights from the survey were:

1. **99%** of you feel the programs & events are most important.
2. **48%** want to see an increase in the number of requests for proposals that are distributed.
3. **46%** value the business referral program.
4. **45%** would like to see an increase in the investment made to the Business Institute.

A special newsletter will be sent in July highlighting the survey results & programs plans.

The **Ask the Expert Program** has proven itself to be of value to you & the general public.
