

The state house recently passed H.B. 257, increasing the minimum wage rate to \$6.25 effective July 1st. Then effective July 1, '07, it would increase to \$7.15 an hour. The measure would also allow for a 60-calendar-day training wage, at which time employers could pay less than the minimum wage for employees under age 20. We will keep you posted on this.
