

The Center for Minority Health received a large grant from the National Institute of Heath for research in trying to solve the disparity in healthcare.

The Pittsburgh Post-Gazette reports that H.J. Heinz has been named #1 in the University of Michigan's American Customer Satisfaction Index.

The PG also reports that the Allegheny Regional Asset District board approved the largest budget in its 14-year history: \$84 million to be distributed to local arts, cultural, & recreational groups in 2008.
