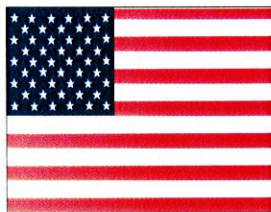

Due to the high level of interest in the Business Plan Seminar in October, two additional seminars were held in November.

A Member's survey is being prepared for sending to you by late January. We want to learn more about your interest in the Chamber & how we can

respond to your requests.

State Government, as well as both City & County Councils have been busy as this year comes to a close. The state bailout package raises the occupation tax from \$10 to \$52 annually & adds a .55% payroll tax eliminating the business privilege tax in 2010. Meanwhile Member Jake Wheatley continues to ask for diversity on the state's oversight board. On a vote of 9-0, Council approved legislation to implement the deep cost reductions required by the Act 47 plan. We owe a debt of gratitude to those who worked so hard on this issue, in particular Barbara McNees, our Associate Member. Stay tuned for further details. County Council voted 10-4 to approve a referendum that would reduce the number of elected county row offices from ten to four, leaving only the district attorney, controller, treasurer & sheriff as elected row offices. All other county row offices would be eliminated as soon as the office holders' current terms expire.
